PICK OF THE WEEK

RESA FANTASTIKT MYSTISK In this production, co-written by Carolyn Almos, Matt Almos, Jon Beauregard, Joel Marshall, Todd Merrill, Katherine Noon, Victor Ortado, Laura Otis and Selina Smith, nothing is quite what it appears to be, so it's difficult to review without giving the game away. The program supplies an earnest biography of the writer, 19th-century Swedish playwright Lars Mattsun, author of Whether Wind Wither You and The Toothless Otter. Things look grim when director-adapter-choreographer Todd Merrill emerges to deliver a slide-lecture on Mattsun's life and works. At first Merrill seems to be a fatuous dunderhead, but it's soon apparent that he's performing a superb deadpan send-up of directors who suffer from delusions of grandeur, academic pedantry and arty pretentiousness. The play itself is a reductio ad absurdum of German-Nordic expressionism, suggesting a loony collaboration between Strindberg and the Brothers Grimm. Painter Philip (Victor Ortado), tormented by artistic ambition, and a lack of both funds and talent, is about to marry Mariah (Selina Smith), who suffers from a bizarre unnamed affliction. A Mysterious Child (Laura Otis) appears to conduct him on a fantastic journey, where he encounters allegorical cats, whores, toreadors, gardeners and generals. The piece ruthlessly skewers theatrical vanity, incompetence and bogus intellectuality. Though the joke is sometimes heavy-handed, it's also clever, erudite and often laugh-out-loud funny.
